Additional Information

- Completion of the Associate of Arts degree will satisfy UW Core General Education Requirements. Students who do not complete the associate degree will have their coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis and may not meet all general education requirements at the receiving university.

- If a student completes BOTH 10-806-177 General Anatomy & Physiology and 10-806-179 Advanced Anatomy & Physiology, they will receive credit at UW-Eau Claire for BIOL 214 Human Anatomy & Physiology I and BIOL 314 Human Anatomy & Physiology II.
- Students cannot take Oral/Interpersonal to fulfill their required Speech credit. It may be used as an elective.
- If students satisfy the world language requirement by transferring in a full year of high school world language credits with a “C” or better, then they may need additional elective credits to satisfy the program credit requirement.
- Courses in the Diversity/Ethnic studies category may apply to the Humanities and/or the Social Science categories.
- Courses in the Global Studies & Languages category may apply to the Humanities and/or Social Science categories.
